My lecture and discussion are focused essentially on de-centring language in our study of language. Sociolinguistics, applied linguistics and related fields are primarily concerned with unpacking the complex role of language in the lives of people, especially in how it is mobilized to create, affirm and transform social relationships. It is almost a truism in our respective fields that language is embedded in the social life of individuals, thus many of us seek to find ‘solutions’ to social ills and educational ‘problems’ through the lens of ‘language’. In the process, our knowledge-making practices are centred on – and I also say, obsessed with – ‘language’ as the entry point and end point of our investigations. This narrows, rather than broadens, the lens through which we see the world in which language is embedded. How might our research questions and practices change through a de-centring language stance? Is this stance, in fact, transformative, or simply a return to the basics of language research? My lecture and the discussion that follows are an invitation to dialogue on why we ask the questions we ask, and do the research that we do.
